2010 New Horizon: Rice Production in the area

Rice is the most widely eaten staple food, but the least produced food in Mozambique. I have a guest from the States and he didn't hide his emotion by saying: "I think I will eat more rice in Mozambique in the next two months that I have eaten in the past twenty year."

In Mozambique, people eat rice from India, Pakistan and China. Over the past years, rice price has drastically increased. No one has control over it.

Carolyn Belshe Orphanage is not out of the law, children eat imported rice. To reduce the outside dependency on rice, we have embarked on rice production, which was not done in the past years.

The aim is to reduce expenses related to rice consumption by producing rice locally.

For the initial phase, rice production will cover one hectare (about 2.5 acres). The expected rice yield is 2000kgs (4 400 pounds) to 3000kgs (5 500 pounds) per hectare.

Children are volunteering working on the rice farm on the weekends. They have been involved in rice transplanting.

- ✍ Training of farmers, students and pastors;
- ✍ Food production for the Orphanage, Seminary School, Boarding Students etc.
- ✍ Supporting local farmers
- ✍ Provide technical assistance to parishes that wish to start an agricultural project;
- ✍ Restocking and providing oxen, goats to local communities through Heifer Initiative
- ✍ Honey Production and training farmers in beekeeping and providing them a credit on beehives,
- ✍ Drilling a well and installing an irrigation system to boost food production;
- ✍ Milk production at the orphanage.
